#### **BBSRC Flexible Talent Mobility Account**

#### **FTMA** aim

- Enable cross-sector and interdisciplinary knowledge exchange within the biosciences by facilitating mobility between academic, business, public sector and third sector organisations
- Enhance sector porosity and allow movement between fields as well as providing professional development opportunities for bioscience research staff, and supporting staff, at all career stages





#### **BBSRC Flexible Talent Mobility Account**

#### **Application process 2024**

- This funding call will support a range of mobility and exchange activities including travel, exchanges, secondments, and placements between BBSRC funding-eligible organisations and other sectors or between significantly different disciplines.
- Focussed on the UKRI strategic theme: <u>securing better health, ageing, and wellbeing</u>

Up to £15K awards to enable cross-sector and interdisciplinary knowledge exchange within healthy ageing and biosciences by facilitating mobility between:

- Academics
- Business
- Public sector
- Third sector organisations

Annual rounds of funding competition will support ≥38 individual projects across three years



#### Activities we will support



- Public and third sector collaboration
- Inter-disciplinary exchange
- Technology transfer
- Secondments
- Training opportunities
- Day / short placements
- International placements
- Exchanges between academics and business



### **Project details**

- Projects can be any duration up to a maximum of six months
- Projects must end no later than the 31st of May 2025



### Who are the applicants?

- Lead
  - Project lead, must be BBSRC-eligible, can be academic, ECR, technical
- Co-applicant
  - Other named BBSRC-eligible applicants, can be academic, ECR, technical
- Collaborator
  - BBSRC non-eligible collaborators, e.g. industry partner
  - Cannot directly receive funding, but can indirectly benefit from funding
- All applicants, co-applicants and collaborators <u>must</u> be members of the consortium
- We can only fund <u>staff</u> on the FTMA call
- Staff contracts must run to the end of the project
- Letters of support from collaborators



#### Overall Project Summary (publicly available)

- Non-confidential summary of the activity or project
- Work to be undertaken
- Development opportunities
- Alignment to one or more Blue Zone Consortium themes
- Alignment to the UKRI strategic theme: securing better health, ageing, and wellbeing
- Use of images is permitted, reduces word count by 50 words



### Project or activity: expected outcomes

- Describe the outputs and/or outcomes will result from this activity
  - new skills or knowledge
  - data production
  - immediate and future potential collaboration
  - joint publications
  - other societal or economic impact

## **Funding**

- Specify any in-kind or financial contributions you will bring to the project
- Please note that <u>all funding must be spent, and activities completed within the time</u> frame stated on the Award Letter with the invoice sent to the Blue Zone Consortium
- You must also include with the application:
  - your <u>approved</u> institutional costing
  - confirmation that the application has been submitted with the agreement of the host institution who, if awarded, would administer the grant
  - Either documents or email communication signed-off by the appropriate institutional signatory are acceptable.



# Funding requested and other funding source(s)

- Funding requested should be based on the estimate provided by your finance department
- If there are cash or in-kind contributions from the UKRI funding-eligible institutions or collaborators on the project (e.g. industry or other sector collaborators), provide an estimate of the value of these contributions
- Letter(s) of support should confirm any in-kind or cash contribution for the project.
- The funding is intended to be flexible but covers direct costs only (at 80% FEC) such as staff costs (full- or part-time), travel and subsistence, consumables and any other direct expenses
- Funds cannot be used for indirect or Estates costs
